

1. (A) Eligibility & Application:-

- Application must hold equivalent qualifications recognized by the Association of Indian University (AIU).
- Submission of transcripts, certificates, and passport is required.
- Some programs may require English proficiency (e.g. IELTS, TDEFL) if the student's prior education was not in English.
- Application can usually be submitted online.

(B) Admission process:-

- Application review by the college or university.
- Verification of documents and eligibility by the Registrar/ Admission office.
- Payment of tuition and other fees (can be done via wire transfer, online banking).
- Issuance of admission letter, required for student visa application.

(C) Visa Procedure

- Students must apply for a student Visa (S-visa) at the nearest Indian embassy or consulate.
- College provide invitation/ admission letter and sometimes a guidance letter visa processing.

(D) Orientation & Registration

- Orientation sessions may include
- Academic calendar
- Safety guidances
- Introduction to faculty and departments.
- International students must register with the college office and often with the Foreigners Regional Registration office (FRRO) if staying longer the 180 days.

2. Facilities Typically provided to International students:-

(a) Academic support

- Dedicated academic advisors or mentors.
- Orientation programs and induction sessions.
- Language assistance (if needed) for non-native English speakers.

(b) Accommodation & Hostel

- On –Campus hostel or partnered accommodation with separate international students rooms.
- Mess / cafeteria services with dietary guidance (vegetarian / non-vegetarian preferences).
- Hostel warden or administrative staff for support

(c) Health & Safety

- Access to on – campus medical or first-aid facilities.
- Guidance on health insurance (mandatory for long-term visas).
- Emergency contact and safety orientation.

(d) Dedicated International students office / cell for quaries and documentation.

- Help with bank accounts, SIM cards, local transportation, and registration with local authorities.
- Assistance with scholarships or free payment procedures.

(e) Cultural & social support:-

- Participation in cultural festivals, students clubs, and extracurricular activities.
- Guidance for adopting to local culture, customs, and academic environment.
- Peer mentoring programs or “buddy system” with Indian students.

3. Specific to Teacher- Education College-

- International student enrolment is usually limited, so personalized attention is possible.
- Programs (B.Ed. / D.Ed.Ed.) may require observation/ practicum in schools- administration help arrange this legally for visa purpose.
- Colleges may not have fully formalized “International office” but the principal/ Administration office acts as the primary coordinator.
